

For the second year running the festival, which will take place on Saturday 26th October, has been generously supported by Arts Council England.

Diwali in Luton Events Manager, Furhaad Ahmed, said: "The Arts Council like to part fund events so the support from Luton BID was essential to obtaining this funding. This year we have also had support from The Mall and Revoluton Arts. It is thanks to all this generosity that our Hindu festival of lights is set to be bigger and better than ever before."

This year the festival returns to St George's Square from 12noon -7.30pm. The free entertainment will include traditional dancing, singing and visual arts along with traditional food and drink.

The Diwali parade, being organised by outdoor arts company Festive Road, will start at 6pm at Market Hill, weave its way down George Street and will finish at St George's Square at around 7pm.

This will be followed by a dramatic firework display from the rooftop of The Mall shopping centre.



Thanks to Luton BID the much-loved **Filmstock** festival is returning to Luton town centre this November – after a 10-year hiatus.

This will be the twelfth Filmstock in Luton's history and will showcase some of the best that modern cinema has to offer, featuring an eclectic programme of independent films from around the world. including feature films, shorts and documentaries.

On top of the screenings taking place at The Hat Factory, The Bear Club and Youthscape, there will be exhibitions, spoken word, live podcast recordings, comedy as well as food and drink.

Audience favourite Filmschlock is back, a screening of a notoriously terrible film for everyone to have a good giggle over, plus new music documentaries, some film exclusives, a rare opportunity to see a historic Luton-related film as well as plenty of social spaces where filmmakers, audiences and volunteers can spend time together over top quality food, coffee and liquor. Not to mention the best coffee in town at Filmstock Fix.

The Filmstock Awards will be overseen by an esteemed jury of filmmakers,

industry professionals and critics, who will also be presenting work and events across the packed 4 day programme.

Chair of Luton Bid, Gavin O'Brien said: 'Filmstock had such a massive cultural impact on the town in the 2000s. We are so excited to be part of bringing it back this November. As well as creating a buzzing cultural event, Filmstock is supporting young and emerging filmmakers. We have no doubt that the Luton BID area will be bursting at the seams with keen film-goers and we can't wait to welcome them'.
