Our remit at Luton BID is to support you, the levy payers

This is Luton BID's eleventh year in operation (our first year of our third five-year term). We are delighted to continue support to businesses for the next five years. Over the past 12 months we have delivered a number of projects to positively impact the town centre.

Luton BID continues to manage and chair Luton Business Against Crime, the Town Centre Crime Reduction Partnership we are a supporting partner to Luton SAFE, pubwatch and operate the DISC system (data intelligence sharing system) for both the day time and night time economy. We have funded NET officers and cleaning machines.

Luton BID has provided events and entertainment such as magicians, free face painting, childrens characters, snowglobes and walking entertainment as well as being a sponsor to a number of large scale events such as St Patricks Parade, Diwali, East fest, Pride, Carnival and Lighting up Luton and we will continue to be creative with ways to encourage footfall into the town centre.

For the past two years we have held monthly litter picks, and we will continue to do this to help keep our town tidy, as well as working with partners to ensure fly tippers and problem areas are managed. We delivered a large scale mural last year on Silver Street, lamp post motifs and a parklet to be used over the school summer holidays and we have provided florals for a number of years to brighten up the

We are working alongside key partners as a number of exciting developments started work last year, and we attend a number of important meetings always representing the businesses within the town centre. We are really looking forward to the difference Luton BID can make this year.

Strive to achieve the best for businesses in Luton town centre, encouraging everyone to work together to create a great working environment, a great place to develop a business and a great business community.
























How to Pay Your Levy
